The Oakville Yacht Squadron (OYS) is the Organizing Authority for these series.

The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the Notice of Race (NOR), Sailing Instructions (SIs) or other additional document means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

1 RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing with Sail Canada Prescriptions.
- 1.2 The racing rules will be changed as outline below. The sailing instructions may also change other racing rules.
- 1.3 RRS 44.1 Taking a Penalty. The first two sentences of Rule 44.1 are change to: 'A boat may take a One-Turn Penalty when she may have broken one or more rules of Part 2 or rule 31 in an incident while racing. However, when she may have broken one or more rules of Part 2 while in the zone around a mark other than a starting mark, her penalty shall be a Two Turn Penalty.'
- 1.4 The Official Notice Board is on the east wall of the OYS club house.
- 1.5 The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and supplementary sailing instructions that will be on the Official Notice Board.
- 1.6 Notices to Competitors may also be posted online on the Racing Schedule and Results page.

2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1 There will be separate sailing instructions for each club racing event. The sailing instructions will be posted approximately 1 week before the event's scheduled date on the Official Notice Board and OYS website.

3 COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 [DP] All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on channel 72.
- 3.2 On the water, the race committee may make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 Registration is open to any member in good standing of Oakville Yacht Squadron (OYS) or the Oakville Club (OC). Members of other clubs may be accepted at the discretion of the Organizing Authority.
- 4.2 Eligible boats may register in PHRF non-flying sails, PHRF flying sails, one-design, cruising or 'Learn to Race' Classes.
- 4.3 Boats intending to race in a PHRF fleet must have a valid Performance Handicap Racing Fleet-Lake Ontario (PHRF-LO) certificate. PHRF handicapped fleets will be split between FS and NFS, and further splits may be made in the individual event SIs.
- 4.4 A one-design fleet may be established if four (4) or more boats of the same class are registered to race. All boats registering for a one-design fleet must comply with their class rules.
- 4.5 A boat shall register at least 48 hours prior to her first Series race
- 4.6 Eligible boats may register by completing the [registration form](#) on the Oakville Yacht Squadron website. All entries are at the discretion of the Organizing Authority.

5 FEES

- 5.1 Non-OYS members shall pay \$250.00+HST to register for all scheduled OYS club racing, exclusive of any applicable PHRF fees.
- 5.2 OYS members requiring a PHRF-LO certificate shall pay \$50.00 inclusive of HST to obtain their PHRF-LO certificate.

6 SCHEDULE

7 VENUE

- 7.1 Tuesday racing will take place with the starting area approximately 2 nm south of the Oakville Harbour Lighthouse.
- 7.2 Thursday racing will take place on Lake Ontario, with the starting area approximately 1nm south of the Oakville Harbour Lighthouse.
- 7.3 All other series races will start approximately one-half mile off the Oakville Harbour Lighthouse.

8 COURSES

- 8.1 Courses to be raced will be outlined in the sailing instructions supplements.

9 PENALTY SYSTEM

- 9.1 For all classes RRS 44.1 is changed as per 1.3 above.
- 9.2 The scoring penalty, RRS 44.3, applies.
- 9.3 Protest forms shall be submitted online at: OYS Protest Console.

10 SCORING

- 10.1 PHRF Classes will be scored using the PHRF-LO Primary Time on Time Formula, corrected to the nearest second.
- 10.2 RRS Appendix A5.3 shall apply.
- 10.3 One race is required to constitute a series.
- 10.4 A boat's midweek Series score shall be the total of her 6 best scores. If fewer than 6 races are completed in a Series, here score will be the total of her scores. A boat's Sunday series score shall be her best 3 scores.
- 10.5 A boat's A and B Combined (Tuesday or Thursday) score will be the total of her 12 best scores.
- 10.6 If a boat registers in a different class for Series A and Series B, she will not be eligible to be scored in the Combined A and B, but she will be eligible for Season Overall awards.
- 10.7 A boat's Season Overall score will be calculated using the Cox-Sprague High Point System.

11 PRIZES

- 11.1 Prizes will be awarded to the top 3 boats in each fleet per event. Additional prizes will be handed out at the end of the season for overall winners.

12 RACE COMMITTEE VOLUNTEERING

- 12.1 All boats registered to race are required to provide volunteer crew for race committee duty sessions. The Race Committee Volunteer Duty Policy is specified in Addendum A.

13 RISK STATEMENT

- 13.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in an increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

14 INSURANCE

- 14.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$2,000,000 per incident or the equivalent.

Addendum A – RACE COMMITTEE DUTY POLICY 2024

The Organizing Authority recognizes that boats have a limited sailing season and want to maximize their time on the water. To ensure our Club Racing program has an ample supply of volunteer Race Committee staff, the following policy is mandated:

- OYS and OC competitors in Mid-week (Tuesday or Thursday) series shall sign up for Duty Sessions for races Organized by OYS.
- A registered boat is responsible for providing a Race Committee Duty Session.
- A Race Committee Duty Session consists of providing two able bodies to the Race Committee for a race. This may be one person for two races or two people for one race.
- There will be Duty Sessions every other Tuesday (BHYC provides opposite) and every Thursday race. A boat is scored RCD during a Race Committee Duty Session. RCD shall be the average of a boat`s non-excluded scores for a series. A boat providing Race Committee Duty for a race is responsible for notifying the Scorer by email of the RCD.
- A web-based calendar will be provided on the OYS website showing available Race Committee Duty Sessions. Boats shall choose their preferred Duty Session dates from the calendar. Boats that have not signed up for the Duty Sessions by May 7, 2024 may be assigned slots by the Race Committee.
- A boat that misses their scheduled Race Committee Duty Session shall be scored as DNE in the best race score of the Series in which they complete the most races.
- Race Committee Duty Sessions performed by OYS members qualify as required volunteer hours only for that member.
